Appropriate vs Inappropriate Play

Humping

- Ultimately NOT appropriate play
- This is a very natural thing for puppies to do, so the puppy may need multiple types of corrections.

Mouthiness

- This is a typical type of dog play. This can be both appropriate and inappropriate play, depending on how hard they may be biting down.
- If they seem to be overly targeting a specific puppy or puppies that seem to be genuinely nervous or in pain, this is the point that it becomes inappropriate.

Growling/Making Noises

This is extremely common and typically sounds much worse than it is. As long as the puppies are "loose" and not barring their teeth, this is absolutely fine behavior.

Corrections

Step One: Puppies Correcting Puppies

Allow puppies to correct each other! This is healthy communication and helps teach puppies what is appropriate and what isn't.

Step Two: Verbal Corrections

Give the puppy who is doing "wrong" a strong but calm verbal correction. Any yelling or high energy verbal correction will excite puppies and will not be very beneficial.

Step Three: Spray Bottle/Shake Can

Squirt the puppy who is doing "wrong" with the spray bottle or shake the can towards the puppy. This may take a couple of sprays/shakes. Be consistent.

Step Four: Remove from Playgroups

If it seems extremely excessive and harming other puppies, and they do not listen to other corrections, remove the puppy from playgroups.
